Winter Fayre





Attendance

Prior to the winter break we saw a steep rise in absences from school, often for extended periods of time. Every day of learning is a key learning day at school. All year groups have many areas of learning that need to be covered as detailed in the National Curriculum. These cannot be repeated, and pupils find it very concerning when they have missed key lessons and experiences when away from school. We understand that there has been a rise in illnesses at this time and would ask that you always speak with office staff to consider the appropriate length of time to stay off school. Please do not keep siblings away from school if they are well.

With regard to holiday in school time, this is not a valid reason to be absent from school. As already detailed, each day of learning is crucial and pupils often find it difficult in class, in all year groups, if they have gaps in their learning. Our curriculum means there are no opportunities to go over previous lessons. We would ask for your support in ensuring that children are in school learning each and every day.
