Criteria	Looked after or previously looked after children.	
	<ol> <li>Children with a brother or a sister already at the academy who will still be in attendance in September 2023.</li> </ol>	
	<ol><li>Children who live nearest the academy.</li></ol>	
	Within each of these categories, priority is given to those who live nearest the academy, calculated on the basis of a straight-line measurement between home and the academy.	
Children with a statement of special educational needs/EHC Plan	Needs/Education Health and Care Plan is required to be admitted to the academy that is named in the statement/plan.	
Looked after or previously looked after children	Children who are looked after or immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, child arrangement order or special guardianship order. This includes any child / young person who is subject to a Full Care Order, an interim Care Order, accommodated under Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989, is remanded or detained into Local Authority accommodation under Criminal Law or who has been placed for adoption.	
Sibling	Siblings (brothers or sisters) are considered to be those children who live at the same address and either:	
	i. have one or both natural parents in common; or ii. are related by a parent's marriage; or iii. are adopted or fostered by a common parent.	
	Unrelated children living at the same address, whose parents are living as partners, are also considered to be siblings.	
	Children not adopted or fostered or related by a parent's marriage or with one natural parent in common, who are brought together as a family by a same sex civil partnership and who are living at the same address, are also considered to be siblings.	
Distance	Distances are calculated on the basis of a straight-line measurement between the applicant's home address and the pupil entrance gate on Summer Lane. The Local Authority uses a computerised system, which measures all distances in metres.	

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	Ordnance Survey supply the co-ordinates that are used to plot an applicant's home address and the address of the academy.	
Shared Responsibility		
Final Qualifier	In a very small number of cases it may not be possible to decide between the applications of those pupils who are the final qualifiers for a place, when applying the published admission criteria.	
	For example, this may occur when children in the same year group live at the same address, or if the distance between the home and academy is exactly the same, for example, blocks of flats. If there is no other way of separating the application according to the admissions criteria and to admit both or all of the children would cause the Published Admission Number for the child's year group to be exceeded, the Local Authority will use a computerised system to randomly select the child to be offered the final place.	
	In the event of this occurring with twins or other multiple birth applicants, academies will be asked to admit over their Published Admission Number to accommodate the pupils.	
Waiting Lists	Waiting lists will not be fixed following the offer of places. They are subject to change. This means that a child's waiting list position during the year could go up or down. Any applicants will be added to the academy's list in accordance with the order of priority for offering places. Waiting lists will be maintained until the end of each academic year.	
Appeals	Appeals are administered by the Local Authority for this school. Appeals will be heard by an independent panel.
