

Playdough

Why we love it in Early Years

Benefits of playdough

- Builds up the muscles in the hands ready for children to write
- Helps with hand eye coordination
- Can calm some children down if they are upset or angry
- Children can be creative with playdough and use their imagination





Playdough Recipe

1 cup of flour ½ cup of salt 2 tablespoons cream of tartar 1 tablespoon of oil 1 cup of boiling water Food colouring

In the bowl add the flour, salt and cream of tartar and mix Add the oil Add food colouring to the water and add to the bowl Mix well.

Once cool wrap the playdough in plastic and store at room temperature.



What could I do with playdough

Dough disco – put some music on and let your child squeeze and roll the play dough

Practice using a knife and fork or scissors and cut up the play dough in to small pieces.

Leaf printing - Find a leaf. Roll out the play dough and gentle press the leaf on to the playdough. The leaf should leaf a print on the playdough.





































SNAIL IN SPACE RACHEL BRIGHT & NADIA SHIREEN WEEKLY BOOK REVIEW - MR GIBLEN

Accomplishing her ambition will take perseverance and hard work, overcoming last-minute hurdles, but, as Gail shows, if you have a dream anything is possible.



Reading to Your Child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love for reading.

- · Make book and stories part of everyday life
- · Building a reading story into a routine e.g. a story at bedtime
- · Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book
- · Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free
- Read in fun places e.g. a den made from blankets
- Give books as a birthday gift this will show you value them
- Keep books in your bag or the car.



Reading Diary Expectations

"Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment everyday not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop broader vocabulary, increase general knowledge and better understanding of other cultures

In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background" (Pearson, 2021)

Here at Chilwell Croft, we place a high importance on daily reading, each child is provided with a reading diary and books to take home, we ask that the reading records are signed off daily and brought into school where they will be collected in, checked and signed off by an adult. This is a non-negotiable expectation.

Holiday Request

Parents are required, under the Education Act (1996) to ensure children attend school regularly. The Headteacher of a school has a discretionary power to authorise absence only in exceptional circumstances. A family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

If you complete a leave of absence request form and the request is declined, (as it will be in the majority of cases) and you still take your child out of school, each parent within the household will potentially be issued with a $\pounds60$ penalty notice for each child you have taken out of school.
