TRACTION MAN - MINI GREY WEEKLY BOOK REVIEW - MR GIBLEN

Traction Man is here! And in case you hadn't worked it out, that is a very good thing! Every good action story needs a hero; and Mini Grey has created a hero for our time with her strong, brave and oh-so-fashion-conscious action figure (who bears absolutely no resemblance to a real-life action figure...none at all!). Traction Man travels from room to room, discovering and resolving all manner of disasters whilst defeating domestic super-villains including, but not limited to; a poisonous dishcloth and some evil pillows. Traction Man-wearing combat boots, battle pants, and his warfare shirt-comes in a box, but very quickly finds the way into the imagination of his lucky boy owner. This superhero searches for the Lost Wreck of the Sieve as the boy makes a game of doing the dishes, and later in the bathtub, he conquers the Mysterious Toes that are stealing his pet, the brave little Scrubbing Brush. These are just a few of the action-packed adventures played out by the boy and his new toy that may not be able to leap tall buildings in a single bound; but can vanquish all manner of villains lurking around the house.

'Traction Man Is Here' is, it is no exaggeration to say, the picture book which ignited my love for picture books; when I found myself working as a teacher in a Year One class, this was the first picture book I read to the class. I was hooked! Mini Grey has taken several familiar concepts: action heroes, toys, make-believe and many more, and woven them into a thoroughly enjoyable comic-book style adventure. With its action and comedy for pupils and clever humour for older readers with some experience of the superhero genre, notably his cool catchphrases and Bond-like suave...ness, this is one of the most requested stories whenever I bring my own books in to share! And with books 2 and 3, 'Traction Man meets Turbo Dog' and 'Traction Man and the Beach Odyssey', already released, there is plenty for this part-Bond, part-GI Joe, all-hero to bring to your classroom


















Road Safety



Reading to Your Child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love for reading.

- · Make book and stories part of everyday life
- · Building a reading story into a routine e.g. a story at bedtime
- Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book
- · Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free
- Read in fun places e.g. a den made from blankets
- · Give books as a birthday gift this will show you value them
- Keep books in your bag or the car.



Reading Diary Expectations

"Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment everyday not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop broader vocabulary, increase general knowledge and better understanding of other cultures

In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background" (Pearson, 2021)

Here at Chilwell Croft, we place a high importance on daily reading, each child is provided with a reading diary and books to take home, we ask that the reading records are signed off daily and brought into school where they will be collected in, checked and signed off by an adult. This is a non-negotiable expectation.

Holiday Request

Parents are required, under the Education Act (1996) to ensure children attend school regularly. The Headteacher of a school has a discretionary power to authorise absence only in exceptional circumstances. A family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

If you complete a leave of absence request form and the request is declined, (as it will be in the majority of cases) and you still take your child out of school, each parent within the household will potentially be issued with a $\pounds60$ penalty notice for each child you have taken out of school.
