phonics

Phonics is a way of teaching children to read quickly and skilfully. They are taught how to:

- recognise the sounds that each individual letter makes; - identify the sounds that different combinations of letters make such as /sh/ or /ee/; and - blend these sounds together from left to right to make a word. Children can then use this knowledge to 'decode' new words that they hear or see. This is the first important step in learning to read.

The following websites will help you support your child at home with their phonics (most of them are free):

Read with Fonics - Contains excellent videos and further guidance

<u>Phonics Play</u> - A wonderful website with online games for your child to play to practise their phonics.

<u>Breakthruchris</u> - Contains lots of short videos to help you revise different phonemes with your child and children really enjoy using them to enhance their learning.

<u>Letter and Sounds</u> - Lots of games to choose from on the left hand side of the webpage.

Phonics Games - Various of fun Phonic games to choose from

Jolly Learning - Jolly Phonics Sound App available.

ICT Games - The literacy section has a range of fun interactive activities.

<u>Alphablocks</u> - A Cheebies to programme for children using phonics. Lots of online games on the Cheebies website and app.

Starfall - Starfall is a free website with online stories for your child to read using their phonic knowledge. It has a variety of games and stories online and if your child clicks on the words, it tells them how to pronounce them.












OI FROG - KES GRAY & JIM FIELD WEEKLY BOOK REVIEW - MR MCGONIGLE

Oi Frog is the story of a frog trying to figure out where he should be sitting. He meets a cat who tries to explain the rhyming rules for where everyone should sit. He discovers where gorillas, puffins, wizards and multitude of other creatures should sit before asking one too many questions!

I love reading Oi Frog to my son and I would recommend this book to anyone in EYFS or Year I as the perfect bedtime story.














Road Safety

Reading to Your Child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love for reading.

- · Make book and stories part of everyday life
- · Building a reading story into a routine e.g. a story at bedtime
- Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book
- . Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free
- Read in fun places e.g. a den made from blankets
- Give books as a birthday gift this will show you value them
- Keep books in your bag or the car.



Reading Diary Expectations

"Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment everyday not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop broader vocabulary, increase general knowledge and better understanding of other cultures

In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background" (Pearson, 2021)

Here at Chilwell Croft, we place a high importance on daily reading, each child is provided with a reading diary and books to take home, we ask that the reading records are signed off daily and brought into school where they will be collected in, checked and signed off by an adult. This is a non-negotiable expectation.

Holiday Request

Parents are required, under the Education Act (1996) to ensure children attend school regularly. The Headteacher of a school has a discretionary power to authorise absence only in exceptional circumstances. A family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

If you complete a leave of absence request form and the request is declined, (as it will be in the majority of cases) and you still take your child out of school, each parent within the household will potentially be issued with a £60 penalty notice for each child you have taken out of school.
