
### Year 6

Here at Chilwell Croft Academy, Personal, Social and Health Education lessons are taught weekly using the SCARF resources.


Across school, we have focused on 'Me and my Relationships' and engaged in a variety of activities.

  - •Why is listening carefully important? How can I be a good listener?


#### Activity - We're all different, we're all special

# THE LAND OF ROAR WEEKLY BOOK REVIEW - MISS SMITH

Twins Rose and Arthur are drifting apart as they prepare for secondary school. Rose is too caught up in her phone, YouTube, makeup, and trying to fit in with the popular crowd to spend time with Arthur. Meanwhile, Arthur feels isolated, anxious, and unsure about his new school. Every summer, the children visit their Grandad, where they used to escape into the Land of Roar—a fantastical world they created in his attic, full of their dreams, fears, and boundless imagination. But this summer, their cherished hideaway is about to be turned into a more grown-up space... until their Grandad is unexpectedly pulled into Roar through an old camp-bed that serves as a portal. The children decide to follow.

What they find in Roar is nothing like the world they left behind. Real danger awaits, and rescuing their Grandad may be just the beginning of their quest. With the help of Arthur's imaginary friend Wininja and Rose's dragons, Pickle and Vlad, they must confront Arthur's sinister nemesis—a villain so dark, vengeful, and chillingly evil that he's the perfect threat to their mission.

This story is full of imagination, adventure and excitement and makes for a perfect read-aloud choice for story time. Land of Roar is an instantly gripping adventure where childhood games become a reality for two twins. I raced my way through it, wondering what dangers twins Rose and Arthur were going to encounter next, whilst simultaneously wanting to visit Roar myself! Land of Roar makes for a fantastic portal story where you can't help but be dragged into this magical land of make-believe in a story full of adventure, magic and friendship.

## Reading to Your Child

It might seem like everything has gone digital, but books still play a very important part in school life. As well as giving your child a head start, developing a love for reading.

- · Make book and stories part of everyday life
- · Building a reading story into a routine e.g. a story at bedtime
- · Stick your feet up and let your child see you reading a book
- · Go to the library so your child can choose some books to borrow for free
- Read in fun places e.g. a den made from blankets
- · Give books as a birthday gift this will show you value them
- Keep books in your bag or the car.



## Reading Diary Expectations

"Evidence suggests that children who read for enjoyment everyday not only perform better in reading tests than those who don't, but also develop broader vocabulary, increase general knowledge and better understanding of other cultures

In fact, reading for pleasure is more likely to determine whether a child does well at school than their social or economic background" (Pearson, 2021)

Here at Chilwell Croft, we place a high importance on daily reading, each child is provided with a reading diary and books to take home, we ask that the reading records are signed off daily and brought into school where they will be collected in, checked and signed off by an adult. This is a non-negotiable expectation.

## Holiday Request

Parents are required, under the Education Act (1996) to ensure children attend school regularly. The Headteacher of a school has a discretionary power to authorise absence only in exceptional circumstances. A family holiday is not an exceptional circumstance.

If you complete a leave of absence request form and the request is declined, (as it will be in the majority of cases) and you still take your child out of school, each parent within the household will potentially be issued with a  $\pounds60$  penalty notice for each child you have taken out of school.
