Communication and Language

- To understanding how to and why listening is important.
 - Learn and use new vocabulary
 - Engages in a variety of stories.
 - Uses stories to build familiarity and understanding
- Asking questions to find out more and check understanding
- Use well-formed sentences to form ideas and describe events.

Literacy

Through our phonics we will be learning:

- Learning set 1/set 2 sounds plus special friends
 - Reading red words
 - Reading simple sentences
- Re-reading books to increase fluency and understanding
 - Understanding and use new vocabulary.
 In writing we will:
 - Form lower case and capital letters
 - Use our phonics to help us spell words
 - Beginning to write short sentences.

Mathematics

We will be focusing on-

- Comparing numbers quantities up to 10 in different contexts, recognising when a quantity is greater than, less than or the same as another (ELG)
- We will explore pattern in numbers to 10 including odds and evens, doubles and how amounts can be distributed equally (ELG)
- Verbally counting beyond 20, recognising the pattern of the number system.

Physical Development

- Demonstrates strength, balance and coordination when playing (ELG)
- Moves energetically, such as running, jumping, dancing, hopping, skipping and climbing (ELG)
 - Is able to negotiate space and obstacles safely, with consideration for himself/herself and others (ELG)
 - Is beginning to show accuracy and care when drawing (ELG)
- Holds a pencil effectively in preparation for fluent writing using the tripod grip in almost all cases (ELG)
- Uses a range of small tools, including scissors, paint brushes and cutlery (ELG)

Expressive Art and Design
