


Year 3

Author Visit

Chilwell Croft welcomed author Ashley
Thorpe, writer of The Boy, To Beat The
Gods and Spirit Warriors, for an engaging
book reading and Q&A session, giving
children a first-hand insight into
storytelling. The visit also included a
creative writing workshop, inspiring pupils
to explore and develop their own writing
skills.



In Maths, Year 3 have been strengthening their place value knowledge by finding 100, 10, and I more or less than a number, using this to spot patterns and build confidence with larger numbers. In English, they've explored word classes—nouns, verbs, adjectives, and adverbs—identifying them in sentences and using them to make their writing more descriptive. In History, they began their Stone Age topic, investigating how life evolved across the Palaeolithic, Mesolithic, and Neolithic periods, including tools, lifestyles, and key developments.



Cooking Club

In Cooking Club, the children had fun making fruit skewers, carefully practicing their knife skills to cut up large fruits before threading them onto skewers.



Year 2

Year 2 children worked enthusiastically in pairs to make bird feeders, linked to their Science topic Animals Including Humans. They used recycled materials such as plastic bottles, string, and bird seed. The children showed great teamwork, taking turns to fill and assemble their feeders, helping each other with tricky parts, and sharing ideas.








Student of the Week






Scientist of the Week -Charles Darwin
